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DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2009

The Directors of Colonial First State Investments Limited, the Responsible Entity of the Colonial First State Cash Management Trust (the "Trust"), present their report together with the financial report for the financial year ended 30 June 2009.

Principal Activity

The Trust continues to invest in accordance with Standard & Poor's AAA and A+ credit rating, maintaining an extremely strong capacity to meet investor requirements for access to funds "at call", while providing competitive short term money market returns.

In line with the conservative requirements of the AAA and A+ credit rating, the investment process continues to focus on maintaining asset quality.

The principal activity of the Trust is to invest in accordance with the investment objectives and guidelines as set out in the current Product Disclosure Statement and in accordance with the provision of the Trust's Constitution.

Date of Constitution and Registration of Trust

The dates of the Constitution and registration of the Trust with the Australian Securities & Investments Commission (ASIC) were 11 May 1999 and 9 June 1999 respectively.

Review Of Operations

Unit Price

Units in the Trust are recorded at \$1.00 and interest is calculated and accrued daily.

Income

The quarterly distribution per unit for the Trust for the years ended 30 June 2009 and 30 June 2008 is disclosed in Note 4 to the financial statements.

Management Costs and Indirect Cost Ratio (ICR)

Management costs include investment expenses, custody fees and management fees paid or payable as provided under the Constitution for the Trust. These costs are not paid directly by the unitholders of the Trust and do not include transactions costs and additional service fees.

The ICR of a Trust is expressed as a percentage, calculated as the Trust's management costs over average net assets.

The ICR for the Trust for the year is 1.10%.

Results

The net profit attributable to unitholders for the year ended 30 June 2009 was \$7,348,903 (2008: \$11,188,879).

Performance

The performance calculation for the Trust is represented by the total return. The total return of the Trust is shown below for the years ended 30 June 2009 and 30 June 2008 and assumes all distributions were reinvested during that period. No allowance has been made for income tax.

The Responsible Entity is incorporated and domiciled in Australia and has its registered office at Level 29, 52 Martin Place, Sydney, New South Wales, 2000.

Scheme Information

The Trust is a registered managed investment scheme domiciled in Australia and has its principal place of business at Level 29, 52 Martin Place, Sydney, New South Wales, 2000.

Unit Pricing Adjustments Policy

There are a number of factors used to calculate unit prices. The key factors include asset valuations, liabilities, debtors, the number of units on issue and where relevant transaction costs. When the factors used to calculate the unit price are incorrect an adjustment to the unit price may be required. The Responsible Entity uses a variance of 0.05% in the unit price before correcting the unit price.

If a unit pricing error is greater than these tolerance levels the Responsible Entity will:

- compensate unitholders' accounts balance if they have transacted on the incorrect unit price or make other adjustments as the Responsible Entity may consider appropriate, or
- where unitholders' accounts are closed we will send them a payment if the amount of the adjustment is more than \$20.

These tolerance levels are consistent with regulatory practice guidelines and industry standards. In some cases we may compensate where the unit pricing error is less than the tolerance levels.

DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2009

Significant Changes in the State of Affairs

There was no significant change in the nature of the Trust's activities during the year.

Matters Subsequent to the End of the Financial Year

No matter or circumstance has arisen since 30 June 2009 that has significantly affected, or may significantly affect:

- (i) the operations of the Trust in future financial years, or
- (ii) the results of those operations in future financial years, or
- (iii) the state of affairs of the Trust in future financial years.

Likely Developments and Expected Results of Operations

The Trust is expected to continue to operate within the terms of its Constitution, and will continue to invest in accordance with its investment objectives and guidelines.

At the time of preparing this report the Responsible Entity is not aware of any likely developments which would impact upon the future operations of the Trust.

Indemnification and Insurance Premiums for Officers and auditors

No insurance premiums are paid for out of the assets of the Trust in relation to insurance cover provided to Colonial First State Investments Limited or the auditors of the Trust. So long as the officers of Colonial First State Investments Limited act in accordance with the Constitution and the Corporations Act 2001, the officers remain indemnified out of the assets of the Trust against losses incurred while acting on behalf of the Trust. The auditors of the Trust are in no way indemnified out of the assets of the Trust.

The Commonwealth Bank of Australia (ABN 48 123 123 124) has paid insurance premiums for the benefit of the officers of the Responsible Entity and the Compliance Committee members. Details of the nature of the liabilities covered or the amount of the premium paid have not been included as such disclosure is prohibited under the terms of the insurance contracts.

Fees Paid to and Interest Held in the Trust by the Responsible Entity or its Associates

Fees paid to the Responsible Entity and its associates out of the Trust's assets during the year are disclosed in the Income Statement.

No fees were paid to the Directors of the Responsible Entity during the year out of the Trust's assets.

There are no interests in the Trust held by the Responsible Entity or its associates at the end of the financial year.

Interests in the Trust

The movement in units on issue in the Trust during the year is set out in Note 6(a) to the financial statements. The value of the Trust's assets at the end of the financial year is set out in the Balance Sheet.

Environmental Regulation

The Trust's operations are not subject to any particular or significant environmental regulations under a Commonwealth, State or Territory law. There have been no known significant breaches of any other environmental requirements applicable to the Trust.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2009

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Basis of Preparation

The previously issued financial report of the Trust for the year ended 30 June 2009 dated 1 September 2009 has been withdrawn and is replaced by this financial report. The revision was necessary due to the subsequent identification of a note disclosure relating to a capital guarantee which was incorrectly included in the financial report. Colonial First State Group Limited does not guarantee any capital shortfall and does not guarantee to pay unitholders a minimum rate of return. This correction has had no impact to the Trust's financial performance and position as at 30 June 2009.

The financial report is a general purpose financial report, which has been prepared in accordance with the Trust's Constitution and the requirements of the Corporations Act 2001, which includes Accounting Standards. Other mandatory professional reporting requirements have also been complied with.

The financial report is prepared on the basis of fair value measurement of assets and liabilities except where otherwise stated.

The Balance Sheet is presented on a liquidity basis. Assets and liabilities are presented in decreasing order of liquidity and are not distinguished between current and non-current. All balances are expected to be settled within twelve months unless otherwise stated. The amounts expected to be recovered or settled after more than twelve months in relation to these balances cannot be reliably determined, except as otherwise stated.

The financial report was authorised for issue by the Directors of the Responsible Entity on 28 April 2010.

Both the functional and presentation currency of the Trust is Australian dollars.

(b) Statement of Compliance

The financial report complies with Australian Accounting Standards, which include Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards ('AIFRS'). Compliance with AIFRS ensures that the financial report, comprising the financial statements and notes thereto, complies with International Financial Reporting Standards ('IFRS').

(c) Investments in Financial Assets Held for Trading

Classification

The Trust's investments are classified as held for trading and initially recognised at fair value not including transaction costs, which are expensed in the income statement.

Recognition/Derecognition

The Trust recognises financial assets and financial liabilities on the date it becomes party to the contractual agreement (trade date) and recognises changes in fair value of the financial assets or financial liabilities from this date.

The derecognition of a financial instrument takes place when the Trust no longer controls the contractual rights that comprise the financial instrument, which is normally the case when the instrument is sold, or all the cash flows attributable to the instrument are passed through to an independent third party.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2009

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

(c) Investments in Financial Assets Held for Trading (continued)

Measurement

After initial recognition, the financial assets held for trading are revalued to fair value at each reporting date.

For financial assets held for trading that are actively traded in organised financial markets, fair value is determined by reference to Exchange quoted market bid prices at the close of business on the balance date.

For investments where there is no quoted market price, fair value is determined by reference to the current market value of another instrument which is substantively the same or is calculated based on the expected cash flows of the underlying net asset base of the investment. The fair value of units in unlisted Managed Investment Schemes is determined by reference to published bid prices at the close of business on the Balance Sheet date being the redemption price as established by the underlying Fund's Responsible Entity.

Gains or losses on investments held for trading are recognised in the Income Statement. Investments of the Trust which are considered to be held for trading are money market securities.

(d) Investment Income

Income is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Trust and the income can be reliably measured. The following specific recognition criteria must also be met before income is recognised:

Interest income

Income is recognised as the interest accrues (using the effective interest rate method, which is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial instrument) to the net carrying amount of the financial asset.

(e) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents in the Balance Sheet comprise cash at bank, deposits held at call and liquid investments which are readily convertible to cash and subject to insignificant risk of changes in value.

For the purposes of the Cash Flow Statement, cash and cash equivalents are as defined above, net of outstanding bank overdrafts if applicable.

(f) Trade and Other Receivables

Receivables are recognised and carried at the original invoice amount, less a provision for any uncollectible debts. An estimate for doubtful debts is made when collection of an amount is no longer probable. Bad debts are written off when identified.

Amounts are generally received within 30 days of being recorded as receivables.

(g) Trade and Other Payables

Liabilities for creditors are carried at cost, which is the fair value of the consideration to be paid in the future for goods and services received, whether or not billed to the Trust.

Payables include outstanding settlements on the purchase of financial assets and liabilities held for trading and distributions payable. The carrying period is dictated by market conditions and is generally less than 30 days.

(h) Taxation

Under current legislation, the Trust is not subject to income tax provided the unitholders are presently entitled to the income of the Trust and the Trust fully distributes its taxable income.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2009

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

(i) Distributions

In accordance with the Trust's Constitution, the Trust fully distributes its distributable income to unitholders. Distributions are payable quarterly. Such distributions are determined by reference to the taxable income of the Trust. Distributable income includes capital gains arising from the disposal of financial assets held for trading. Unrealised gains and losses on financial assets held for trading that are recognised as income are transferred to net assets attributable to unitholders and are not assessable and distributable until realised. Capital losses are not distributed to unitholders but are retained to be offset against any realised capital gains.

(j) Terms and Conditions on Units

Each unit issued confers upon the unitholder an equal interest in the Trust, and is of equal value. A unit does not confer any interest in any particular asset or investment of the Trust. Unitholders have various rights under the Constitution and the Corporations Act 2001, including the right to:

- have their units redeemed;
- receive income distributions;
- attend and vote at meetings of unitholders; and
- participate in the termination and winding up of the Trust.

The rights, obligations and restrictions attached to each unit are identical in all respects.

(k) Net Assets Attributable to Unitholders

Under AASB 132 "Financial Instruments: Disclosure and Presentation", contractual obligations are regarded as liabilities. As unitholders have the ability to redeem units from the Trust, all net assets attributable to unitholders have been recognised as liabilities of the Trust, rather than as equity. The classification of net assets attributable to unitholders does not alter the underlying economic interest of the unitholders in the net assets and net profit attributable to unitholders of the Trust.

(I) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Income, expenses and assets, with the exception of receivables and payables, are recognised net of the amount of GST to the extent that the GST is recoverable from the taxation authority. Where GST is not recoverable, it is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense item as applicable.

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST.

Reduced input tax credits (RITC) recoverable by the Trust from the Australian Taxation Authority are recognised as a receivable in the Balance Sheet.

Cash flows are included in the Cash Flow Statement on a gross basis. The GST component of cash flows, which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority are classified as operating cash flows.

(m) Expense Recognition

Expenses are recognised in the Income Statement when the Trust has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event that can be reliably measured. Expenses are recognised in the Income Statement if expenditure does not produce future economic benefits that qualify for recognition in the Balance Sheet.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2009

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

(n) New Application of Accounting Standards

Certain new accounting standards and interpretations have been published that are not mandatory for 30 June 2009 reporting periods. The impact of these new standards and interpretations is set below:

- AASB 8 "Operating Segments" and AASB 2007-3 "Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards" arising from AASB 8.
 - AASB 8 and AASB 2007-3 are effective for annual reporting periods beginning on or after 1 January 2009. The Trust has not adopted these standards early. Application of these standards will not affect any of the amounts recognised in the financial statements, but may affect the segment disclosures provided in Note 9.
- Revised AASB 101 "Presentation of Financial Statements Revised" and AASB 2007-8 "Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards" arising from AASB 101.
 - AASB 101 (Revised) is applicable to annual reporting beginning on or after 1 January 2009. The Trust has not adopted this standard early. It requires the presentation of a statement of comprehensive income and makes changes to the statement of changes in equity but will not affect any amounts recognised in the financial statements. If the Trust has made a prior period adjustment or has re-classified items in the financial statement, it will need to disclose a third balance sheet, this one being at the beginning of the comparative period.
- AASB 132 Financial Instruments: Presentation and AASB 2008-2 Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards
 Puttable Financial Instruments and Obligations Arising on Liquidation (Revised AASB 132).
 - Revised AASB 132 is applicable for reporting periods beginning on or after 1 January 2009. The Trust has not adopted this standard early. Application of this standard will not affect any of the amounts recognised in the financial statements as the Trust is obligated to distribute all of its taxable income in accordance with the Trust's Constitution. Accordingly, there will be no change to classification of unitholders' funds as a liability and therefore no impact on profit or loss and equity.
- AASB 7 Financial Instruments: Disclosure and AASB 2009-2 Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards -Improving Disclosures about Financial Instruments
 - Revised AASB 7 is applicable for reporting periods beginning on or after 1 January 2009. The Trust has not adopted this standard early. The amendments require fair value measurement disclosures to be classified into a new three-level hierarchy and additional disclosures for items whose fair value is determined by valuation techniques rather than observable market values. The amendments will not affect any of the amounts recognised in the financial statements but may affect certain disclosures.

(o) Comparatives

Comparative figures are, where appropriate, reclassified so as to be comparable with the figures and presentation in the current year.

2. AUDITORS' REMUNERATION

Auditors' remuneration in respect of auditing the financial report is fully paid by the Responsible Entity.

Other services provided by the auditors are the audit of the compliance plan of the Trust and tax compliance services. The auditors' non-audit remuneration is not paid by the Trust.

(ii) Compensation of key management personnel

No amounts are paid by the Trust directly to the Directors of the Responsible Entity of the Trust.

The Directors of the Responsible Entity receive compensation in their capacity as Directors of the Responsible Entity. Directors are employed as executives of the Commonwealth Bank of Australia, and in that capacity, part of their role is to act as a Director of the Responsible Entity. Consequently, no compensation as defined in AASB 124: Related Parties is paid by the Trust to the Directors as Key Management Personnel.

(c) Responsible Entity's Management Fees

Under the terms of the Constitution, the Responsible Entity is entitled to receive a monthly management fee which is expressed as a percentage of the total assets of the Trust (i.e. excluding liabilities). This fee is paid directly by the Trust on a monthly basis. The Constitution allows a maximum fee of 1.15% per annum. The fee charged to the Trust during the current year is 1.10% per annum (2008 - 1.09% per annum).

The Responsible Entity's fees for the years ended 30 June 2009 and 30 June 2008 are \$1,759,202 and \$1,989,540 respectively. As at 30 June 2009 and 30 June 2008, the total amount owed to the Responsible Entity in relation to management fees are \$143,379 and \$523,970 respectively.

(d) Bank and Deposit Accounts

The bank account for the Trust is held with the Commonwealth Bank of Australia. Fees and expenses are negotiated on an arm's length basis. Various short term money market securities are from time to time transacted through the Commonwealth Bank of Australia which receives a fee which is negotiated on an arm's length basis.

(e) Unitholdings

Colonial First State Investments Limited, its affiliates and other Funds managed by Colonial First State Investments Limited as well as the Directors of Colonial First State Investments Limited do not hold any units in the Trust.

9. SEGMENT INFORMATION

The Trust operates in one business segment, being investment management. The Trust also operates from one geographic location being Australia, from where its investing activities are managed. Revenue is derived mainly from interest.

10. FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT

The Trust's activities expose it to a variety of financial risks: market risk (interest rate risk), credit risk and liquidity risk.

The Trust's overall risk management programme focuses on ensuring compliance with the Trust's Product Disclosure Statement/Information Memorandum and seeks to maximise the returns derived for the level of risk to which the Trust is exposed. Financial risk management is carried out by the investment management department (Investment Manager) and regularly monitored by the Compliance Department of the Responsible Entity.

The Trust uses different methods to measure different types of risk to which it is exposed. These methods include sensitivity analysis in the case of interest rate and ratings analysis for credit risk.

(a) Market Risk

(i) Interest rate risk

The Trust's investments in interest bearing financial assets are exposed to the risks associated with the effects of fluctuations in the prevailing levels of market interest rates on its financial position and cash flows. The Trust is exposed to cash flow interest rate risk on financial instruments at variable rates. Financial instruments at fixed rates expose the Trust to fair value interest rate risk. The risk is measured using sensitivity analysis.

The Trust may also enter into derivatives financial instruments to mitigate the risk of future interest rate changes in accordance with the risk policies and guidelines of the Investment Managers. These transactions are regularly monitored by the Compliance Department of the Responsible Entity.

The table below summarises the Trust's exposure to interest rate risks. It includes the Trust's assets and liabilities at fair values.

(c) Credit risk

Credit risk primarily arises from investments in money market securities. Other credit risk arises from cash and cash equivalents, deposits with banks and other financial institutions and amounts due from brokers.

The Trust invests in money market securities which have an investment grade as rated by the Standard & Poor's rating agency. For unrated assets a rating is assigned by the Investment Manager using an approach that is consistent with the approach used by rating agencies.

The Compliance Department of the Responsible Entity regularly monitors the credit risks that arise from holding these securities.

The exposure to credit risk for cash and cash equivalents is low as all counterparties have a rating of AA or higher (as determined by the Standard and Poor's or equivalent agency).

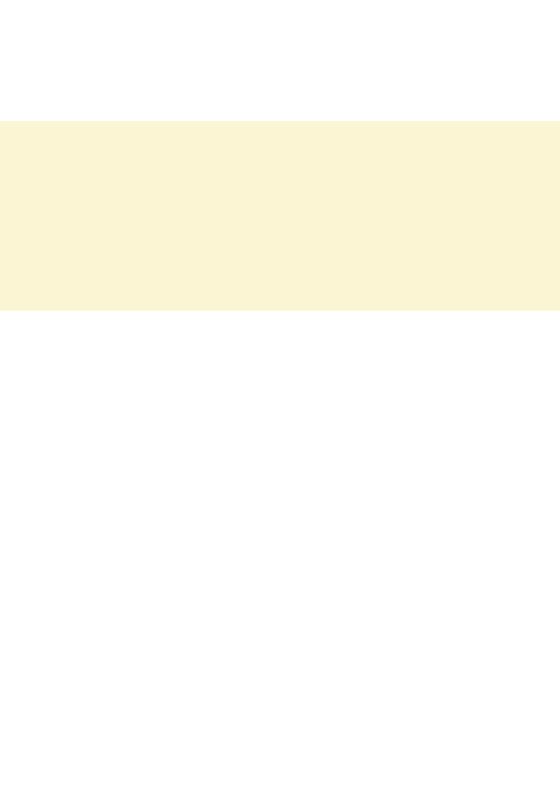
